Ten Years of Global Health Ethics Education Research and Practice: Ten Unpublished Papers and Lessons from the Arctic

Abstract: This seminar will explore the methods, findings, and implications of a decade-long program of research, education and practice in Global Health Ethics. Topics include: 1. Defining Global Health using an Empirically Derived Taxonomy; 2. Qualitative Analysis of Values in Global Health Institutions; 3. Motivation of Postgraduate Trainees Studying Global Health; 4. Best Practices in Teaching Global Health Ethics; 5. Global Health Ethical Perspectives of Global Health Specialty Trainees; 6. Guidelines for Ethically and Educationally Sound Global Health Electives in Postgraduate Medicine; 7. Ethical Commitments of International Public Health Practitioners; 8. Ethical Intersections of Global Health and Indigenous Health; 9. Global Health Perspectives of Humanitarians in Training; 10. Using the Global Health Ethical Reflection Matrix (GHERM) – American Experiences. The last third of the seminar will be an interactive session (using iclickers) exploring challenging ethical dilemmas, and their resolution using the GHERM framework, from Canada's North.
